Promote waste minimization, reuse, recycling and recovery of waste	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 150 recycling facilities in the database - Identified 50 recycling facilities to support - E-Waste recycling - Recycling forum – Sekhukhune, Mogalakwena - Plan 2017/18 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Training (Owners and Employees) – NRF - Registration – design drawings outsourcing - School recycling programme – Lephalale, Sekhukhune - Industrial Symbiosis Programme – launched April '19

- Implementation report not submitted
 - Legislation and regulation implementation – challenges and opportunities
 - NWMS implementation report
 - IWMP implementation report
- Continual amendment of policies and legislation
 - No costing to new policies and legislation – finances not following the functions
 - Difficulty to keep abreast especially amongst the regulated community
 - Licensing processes keep changing – need to fully engage with EIA unit
- Industry Waste Management Plan implementation
 - Provinces and municipalities left out. Project implemented
- Poor coordination on national funded project
 - EPIP, Waste Bureau. Limited support to local initiatives
- RESP significance critical
 - R5 million is limiting
- Development of GRAP Reporting requirements
 - Compliance Discounting Factor
 - Standardised factors
