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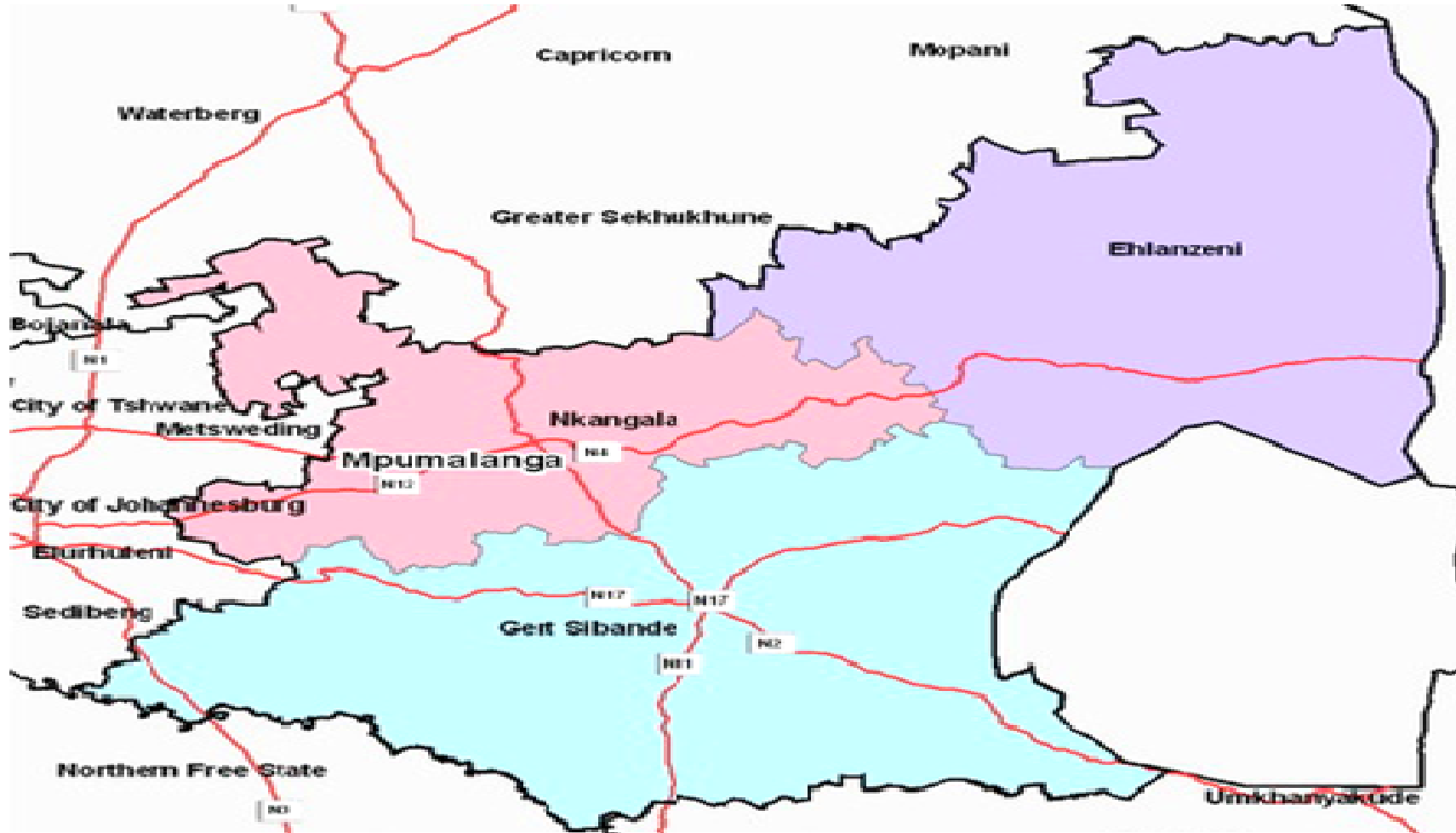

- Chaired and co-ordinated by the Department of Agriculture, Rural Development, Land and Environmental Affairs (DARDLEA) and COGTA.
- Quarterly Meetings.
- Members: DARDLEA, COGTA, MISA, SALGA, DWS, DWA, Districts and Local Municipalities
- To establish Government – Industry Forum

# Status of IWMPs and By-Laws

# Enterprise Development following the Waste Summit in White River

- Engagement of key Stakeholders in the Waste Recycling Industry
  - To have follow up meetings
- Creation of Strategic Market:
  - Establishment of government/ municipality owned Trade Entities;
  - Identification of waste commodities which will be suitable for the province;
  - Trade Centres (trade in reclaimed waste material) – e.g. at district level or at strategic points in the Province;
- Economic Instruments & Regulatory Mechanisms:
  - Facilitation Fund for starting up and maintaining waste reclamation trade entities – e.g. Co-operatives;
  - Research & Development (Capacity for the Province) through tertiary and other accredited research Institutions.
  - Link to existing national economic instruments.
- Implementing Agents:
  - Local Government – primary responsibility for IWMPs;
  - CBOs, NGOs and Industry
  - National and Provincial Government to provide a Regulatory Framework and play oversight role



# Achievements

- Achieved 60% awareness on compliance promotion at waste disposal sites
- Increase in recycling initiatives and waste sorting, e.g. at landfill sites
- Illegal dumping sites are reduced
- Job creation through Youth Jobs in Waste
- The number of designated EMIs has increased to 45%

# Achievements

- Industries and Local Municipalities reporting on Waste Information System
- Clean-ups targets were exceeded with the support of Plastic SA
- DARDLEA conducted Greenest Municipality Competition Road show in all 18 Local Municipalities

# Challenges

- Some landfill sites have been issued with closure licenses but still operating due to unavailability of alternative.
- Lack of capacity to implement the NWMS (IWMPPs) both at provincial and municipal level.
- Extension of waste services in rural areas (establishment of business)
- Intervention in assisting Waste Pickers

# Challenges Cont.....

- Intervention with management of waste disposable nappies
